### **Parent Advisory Committee**

Macopin School, consistent with West Milford Township Board of Education Policy, is committed to establishing a meaningful home, school, and community partnership. To that end, this Parental Involvement Policy is developed collaboratively and/or in conjunction with parents of Macopin School as part of our Parent Advisory Committee (PAC). We consider the parent/guardian as the child's first teacher and encourage and support continued ownership throughout the child's educational career. In this policy, we affirm:

- Macopin School and Parent Advisory Committee will jointly develop the Parental Involvement Policy. Evidence of parental involvement will be retained at the building level.
- > Macopin School will distribute the Parental Involvement Policy and School Parent Compact to parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, and to the extent practicable, in a language the parents understand.

#### **Basis in Statute**

PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT, which provide statutory definitions. Macopin School will carry out programs, activities, and procedures in accordance with the following definitions.

- > Sec. 1112 In order to help low-achieving children meet challenging achievement academic standards, each local educational agency plan shall include a means to:
  - assist in diagnosis, teaching, and learning in the classroom in ways that best enable low-achieving children to meet State student achievement academic standards;
  - determine the success of children in meeting the State student academic achievement standards and do well in the local curriculum; and,
  - provide information to teachers, parents, and students on the progress being made toward meeting those standards.
- > Sec. 1118 Parental involvement means the participation of parents in regular, two-way and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities, ensuring that:
  - Parents play an integral role in assisting their child's learning.
  - Parents are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education at school.

 Parents are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child.

### Implementation of the Parental Involvement Policy
